of those https://www.livingtradition.co.uk/ also publish a magazine and I was invited to forward a letter to the editor explain what we'd been up to during lock down. Twe added a copy of the letter below as it in some measure explains what we've been up to these last 12 months. "Gruden Bay Folk Club was formed in 2012 since when it has net on the last Friday of the morth without fail, until Covid 19 arrived in March 2020, since then all of our regular Club Nights have been cancelled in accordance with government guidance and general safety concerns for our members. I don't think anyone foressow the impact the pandemic would have on our lives generally, and how much it would affect our ability to meet regularly as a folk club. By the time a year had passed, with no sign of things improving, we decided to have a go at hosting a virtual club night, using the now commonplace virtual meeting media of Zoom, which some of us had become familiar with for one reason or another. It would be fair to say that our first attempt was less smooth than subsequent explosed with was obvious that we had found an alternative way of getting together and sharing our love of music with others. From the positive feedback given by many of the 50 people who attended our first Virtual Club night on Friday the 26th of March 2021, it was obvious to all that we should do it again, since then we have held a Virtual Club Night to the last Friday of every 2<sup>est</sup> month, this frequency allows us plenty time to pull things together, and to deliver an enjoyable programme of entertainment. We'd realised quickly that performing live on Zoom was very problematic as the audio visual content was difficult to control, with too many factors which could inperformers recorded their songs on their phones and after sharing them with the organisers, they could be collated into a programme and shared this way. The result was an immediate success, and although a long way from the norm of meeting and ploying live, it proved to be a workable alternative. This appr
